TRAINING IN JUDGING PHOTOGRAPHIC IMAGES

The **Board of Directors** is considering investing in the development of judging skills in our club.

Our Board believes that there would be significant advantages for both the club and for the individuals who would like to learn to judge:

- Our club would be in a better position to get stronger judges for our competitions if we had more members who could provide a judging service for other clubs.
- Members with good judging experience understand what makes an image better than average - a skill that is likely to help them improve their own photography.

The program we are considering would probably consist of two parts:

- A Saturday morning or a weekday evening workshop in which a basic approach to judging would be reviewed, as well as good practise in delivering an analysis that can help the image-maker;
- Followed by a full day CAPA judge's training session here at our club run by a CAPA-approved trainer. (CAPA is the Canadian Association for Photographic Art) Such a session would normally cost each participant about \$125-150, but our club is considering subsidizing this fee significantly so that the cost would not be a barrier foranyone who really wants to learn this skill.

There are no prerequisites for taking this training except a strong desire to learn how to analyse the strengths and weaknesses of photographic images, and the time and energy to practice it. No commitment to do outside judging sessions will be demanded but some involvement in in-club judging and coaching could be expected in the future. With the likely expansion of remote judging we are likely to need more members willing and able to provide this service occasionally.


What we need from you at this point, if you are interested, is some expression of interest in participating in such training. More information on the details of such a program will be made available if we feel there is a strong enough interest in the program.

PROGRAM NOTES

** Thursday, March 6th, 2014:
American Artifacts: Presented by Phil Bergerson



Phil Bergerson has been photographing and exhibiting internationally for over 35 years. His work can be found in many significant public and private collections, including the National Gallery of Canada, the Bibliotheque Nationale in Paris, and the Canadian Museum of Contemporary Photography. He has been awarded several Canada Council and Ontario Arts Council grants and his photographs have been published in The New Yorker and The New York Times Magazine as well as in

Toronto Life and Walrus. His critically acclaimed book, Shards of America was published in 2004 by the New York Publisher - Quantuck Lane Press.

Now Professor Emeritus, Bergerson taught photography at Ryerson University from 1975 until his retirement in 2005. There he received many awards including the prestigious Sahota Award for excellence in teaching and creative research. His

influential organizational achievements include the establishment of the annual international "Kodak Lecture Series", a National Conference on Photography in Canada, ("Canadian Perspectives"), and the first International Symposium on Photographic Theory.

Phil also established and directed several photographic study trips to Europe and Asia. In January 2014, Bergerson's next book, American Artifacts, (Black Dog Publishing), will be launched at the Ryerson Image Centre in conjunction with the exhibition of his work there titled "Emblems and Remnants of the American Dream".

SATURDAY WORKSHOPS

** Saturday March 8th @ 9:00 - 11:30 AM Black & White Photography by Dave Penty

We all see in colour. Regardless of your preferences in more or less colour, knowing how to make pleasing black and white images can definitely improve your photographic skills. Interesting Black and White images start with the eye of the photographer and usually end in the computer and the printed image. This workshop will investigate the realm of tonal recognition in the viewfinder, the relationship of dark and light, contrast, form and space, and the challenge of mixing these elements into a pleasing composition.

Rather than a technical workshop of the nature of Ansel Adams zone system, or a detailed analysis of paper capability, this workshop will concentrate on the rudimentary fundamentals of visualizing compositional elements, and then taking the raw image through the computer steps to finalize the composition to a finished product. We will explore the NIK software in the final stage and also look at the capabilities of paper (matte, glossy, etc) to accentuate the final image. This workshop will be a joint fun experience - please bring your camera to explore elements within the grounds of the Cawthra Centre.
